Romans in thirty



Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 1:1-17

Reflect:

Who is the author of this passage? What are his circumstances?

Who is the audience and what is his main message to the audience?

What word or phrase sticks out to you? What draws you to it? What lesson or action might God be calling you towards?

Respond:

Share your word or phrase with the Real Life community journeying through Romans with you. You can do this on our Facebook page or blog. In fact, throughout your journey through Romans, you'll come across several words or phrases that God draws your attention to as you read. Share what you discover! Scripture is intended to be read in community, so find a way to share what He's teaching you today!

Day Two

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Read: Romans 1:18-2:16

Reflect:

Who is the wrath of God being revealed to in this passage and why? What have they failed to do?

Who is responsible for judging others for their actions? If it is not us as Christians, what are we called to do and what is promised to us if we do it?

This is a heavy passage. What sticks out to you? Why?

Respond:

Find a trusted person and have a conversation about this passage. Don't expect to find answers or win a debate – just try to find a listening ear to help clarify where you are at. If verbal processing isn't your thing, find another expressive outlet like journaling, prayer, etc.

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Read: Romans 2:17-29

Reflect:

Try summarizing this passage in one sentence. What do you see as the main idea of today's reading?

Where do you see this idea being played out in your day-to-day life? Give a specific example.

Respond:

Identify a physical manifestation of your values or about what you think is generally cool. This could be a sticker on your car, a t-shirt with a certain print, a tattoo, a movie, a certain team's jersey, a car choice, anything.

Think about what this outward projection says about your inward values. Do they mesh? Do they mesh with God's call in your life? Does it matter?

Day Four

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 3:1-20

Reflect:

Why might verses 1-8 be considered funny?

Verse 20 seems to be the crux of today's reading, indicated by the word, "therefore" (NIV). Go back and re-read 9-20 to understand why this "therefore" is true.

Respond:

Identify some social norm that you take pride in following. It could be holding the door for another, taking your hat off at the dinner table, saying "excuse me," etc. Where does this desire come from? Why is this action or behavior important to you? What do you gain? What do others gain?

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Read: Romans 3:21-31

Reflect:

What does this passage say about faith?

What does this passage say about the law?

Respond:

Has your perception of faith and the "law" ever conflicted? There are times that one or both can be wrong. Identify the supports you use to work through the conflict.

Day Six

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 4

Reflect:

The dominant word in today's reading is faith. Write two sentences about faith based on what you've read today.

Respond:

Look back on what you have read in Romans up to this point. Identify a verse that you connect with and write it down somewhere you'll see it daily. This could be a sticky-note placed on the dashboard of your truck, a journal entry, a scrap of paper tucked into your pocket for the day, etc.

Day Seven

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 5:1-11

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Read: Romans 5:12-21

Reflect:

Try praying a prayer of thanks to our God for His grace in your life. Try doing it multiple times today. Then, in the evening, find someone to talk to about it.

Day Nine

Read: Romans 6:1-14

Reflect:

Identify the crux verse in this passage, the one that seems to sum it up best.

Respond:

Try to have that verse memorized by the end of the day. Recite it to someone for extra credit.

Day Ten

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 6:15-23

Reflect:

Define the term "slave" in your own words.

How does this idea help inform our relationship with God?

Respond:

As you go about your day, try to identify possible indicators of slavery in your life. If someone were to look at your stuff, where would they say your loyalty lies?

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 7:1-6

Reflect:

We don't serve because of the law, we serve because of the Spirit. Rewrite this passage below in your own words:

Respond:

Try being thoughtful about why you are going about what you're doing today. Pray about it. Ask God to help you see the difference between doing things because you have to, versus doing things because you are motivated by the Spirit.

Day Twelve

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 7:7-25

Reflect:

Paul is clearly struggling here. What is causing the tension?

That last verse is pretty interesting. What do you think it means?

Respond:

There is God's law and the laws of sin. In your life, what are you doing when you are following God's law? What are you seeing, saying, and doing?

What are you doing when you are following the law of sin? What are you seeing, saying, and doing?

Spend some time worshiping and thanking Jesus. He is our victory!

Day Thirteen

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 8:1-14

Reflect:

According to the passage, we live by either the sinful nature in us or the Spirit of God in us. How might we know which is which?

Respond:

Identify a person that helps you live by the Spirit of God in you. Let them know. You don't have to say the exact words, just let them know that you appreciate their positive influence.

Read: Romans 8:15-30

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

For extra credit: Take some time to read the story of Moses and Pharaoh in Exodus 5:1-15:21 and see the progression of Pharaoh's heart hardening to a point beyond his own control.

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 9:19-33

Reflect:

After reading the entire passage, go back and interpret the illustration Paul makes in verse 21. What is Paul saying there?

Respond:

What do you think God has created you to be in this life?

What might be a stumbling stone that could get in the way of that?

Reflect:

Respond:

Try responding to God by expressing your own doxology to Him. Write it down or just work it out in your head. You might be surprised by what you create!

Day Twenty-two

Read: Romans 12:1-13

Reflect:

Pick out three points from this passage that stick out to you or that you connect with. Why did you pick these three?

Respond:

This passage can be read as a how-to guide concerning how to live with others: family, friends, neighbors, coworkers, etc.

Which one of your communities do you think needs these demonstrated the most? Why?

Now, do one thing today that demonstrates what you would like to see in that community.

Day Twenty-three

Lord God, thank you for the space to read your word today. Please be my guide during this time. I believe your word and its power to speak truth in my life. Help me dwell on the truth you have for me in this passage. In your name I pray, amen.

Read: Romans 12:14-21

Reflect:

What part of this passage do you think you need to hear the most? Which part hits home?

Respond:

Read: Romans 13:8-14
