Connect to God's story

Jesus asked over 100 questions in the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John). Some of those questions caused those he questioned to connect, to reveal, to examine themselves, etc...

Read Luke 6:32-36

How do Jesus' questions challenge how far your love reaches? All humans love someone, is God's love set apart here?

In the Scriptures, why do you think Jesus answers questions with questions? How can this help Him get to the root of an issue? Has he ever done this with you?

Read Matthew 15:33-34

Re-read the question Jesus asked in verse 34. What did his question reveal about His disciples? What do we learn from this question? What can God do with our little offering?

Read Matthew 6:25-34

In the space below, write out the 8 questions Jesus asks:

Why are these important questions to ask ourselves today when faced with worries and fears about tomorrow?

Where do you see God at work today? How can you go about this week seeking His kingdom first and trusting Him for the rest?

Now what?

So starting this week consider doing one or more of the following:

- 1. Write down some of the questions Jesus asked in the Scripture readings today and spend time pondering them in prayer with the Lord.
- 2. Decide to trust Jesus when He answers you're question with a question that He has your best in mind. Commit to memory Isaiah 55:8-9.

THE PURPOSE OF LIFE GROUPS

Life Groups exist to promote spiritual maturity and personal growth through meaningful relationships with Jesus and each other through the study of God's Word (Romans 8:29 & Hebrews 10:24-25).

Here's how we accomplish this in our community throughout the week:

SHARE

Each week we'll take time to share what is happening in our lives. At first this sharing will include planned "sharing questions." But after the first few weeks, it will become more informal and personal as we feel more comfortable.

STUDY

Each week we'll study a section from God's Word that relates to the previous weekend's sermon or an appropriate personal growth topic. Our goal is to learn how to live out our Christianity in everyday life by following Jesus.

SUPPORT

Each week we'll learn how to take care of one another as Christ commanded (John 15:9-13). This care can take many forms such as prayer, encouragement, listening, challenging one another and meeting real needs.

SERVE

Spiritual growth is fostered not only by what we gain through the support and input of others, but also through service to others. The role each of us fills is important to the health of the church and for us to be the hands and feet of Jesus to the community in which we live (Ephesians 4:11-16).

Throughout the quarter, it is our hope that you can find and/or be affirmed in the ways God has designed you to serve and make a difference in God's kingdom!
