Paul ends the greeting to the saints (holy people) in Ephesus by giving them this blessing: "May God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ give you grace and peace." How have you experienced grace and peace? Why might it be important for us to remember where grace and peace flow from?

Grace is undeserved favor given to people by God. It is not getting what you deserve, but rather it's getting what you don't deserve. (Ephesians 1:7) When have you experienced getting what you don't deserve? What happens when you give that same grace to others? Why is being grace filled important?
